NEW ORCHESTRA DIRECTOR NAMED


Dr. Douglas Morrison was recently named as Director of Orchestral Studies at West Texas A&M University. A native of Michigan, Dr. Morrison completed his advanced studies at Michigan State University, studying conducting with Leon Gregorian, previously having studied privately with Dr. Valter Poole, former Associate Conductor of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Upon completion of undergraduate studies in Michigan, Mr. Morrison served on the faculty of the Armed Forces School of Music, in Norfolk, Virginia, following which he returned to the Detroit area, where he became Music Director of the Scandinavian Symphony Orchestra, the Dearborn Choral Art Society, and the Michigan Lyric Opera Company.

The Central Kentucky Youth Orchestras, The Kentucky Youth Chamber Orchestra, and concurrent duties at the Stephen Foster Music Camp led Morrison and his family to the Lexington, Kentucky, area after which the move was made back to Michigan to complete his doctoral studies.

During his time at Michigan State University, Douglas Morrison conducted the University Opera Theater, the Campus Orchestra, and was assistant conductor of the University Symphony Orchestra; it was also during this time that Dr. Morrison became associate conductor of the Battle Creek Symphony.

In his time at East Carolina University, Dr. Morrison built the ECU orchestra program into one of the finest in the southeast. In addition to regular season concerts on campus, Douglas Morrison led the orchestra on an historic tour of the Czech Republic and Austria in 1999, as the first American orchestra to be invited to perform in the annual *International Festival of Student Orchestras* in Prague.

Active as a conductor of opera and ballet, including fully staged productions of Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro* and *Der Schauspieldirektor*, Humperdinck's *Hansel und Gretel* and Tschaikovsky's *Nutcracker Ballet*, Morrison has also conducted performances with the ECU Opera Theater and ECU Summer Theater program.

A strong advocate of taking music outside of academia and into the community, Dr. Morrison lead the East Carolina University Symphony Orchestra in many outreach, educational, and "pops" concerts, and appeared as guest conductor/clinician with regional high school honor orchestras throughout North Carolina and Virginia.

We welcome Dr. Morrison and look forward to his contributions to the WTAMU orchestra program.

FACULTY FOOTNOTES

Joe Ella Cansler, musical director of the outdoor drama TEXAS 2002, conducted and directed 50 plus shows this summer with the new artistic director Lynn Hart. She traveled over much of the US to audition over 1400 people for roles in the newer version of the show with all live music. It was well received and next year will bring many more exciting changes.

Dr. Cansler was invited to observe and participate in this summer's Santa Fe Opera Apprentice Program July 14-18 in a collaborative effort with Mary Jane Johnson. She had opportunity to observe and critique apprentice vocal coaching sessions, follow rehearsal scene staging, "sits" probing, and costuming; then she observed actual performances of La Traviata, Eugene Onegin, La Clemenza di Tito, and The Italian Girl in Algiers. She had the opportunity to exchange ideas with Bruce Donnell, Santa Fe Opera director of La Traviata and John Crosby, orchestra conductor, which added insight into repertoire, technique, directing, conducting and counseling students for a professional career.

The Stone Fort Wind Quintet at Stephen F. Austin University will premier a new woodwind quintet composed by **Dr. Joe Nelson** in November and perform it at TMEA in February

Douglas Storey, associate professor, was awarded a faculty teaching excellence award at the spring commencement ceremonies.

William Takacs, instructor of trumpet, was named prinipcal trumpet of the Amarillo Symphony following auditions in August.

MUSICAL THEATRE


